- March 22, 2004 Articles of Incorporation submitted to the State of California, Secretary of State. Articles of Incorporation endorsed and filed by the Secretary of State from California.
- April 20, 2004 IRS assigns the foundation the 501 (c) 3 Non-Profit Tax Number Issued.
- June 22, 2004 Filing application and fee submitted to the State of California, Secretary of State.

- To provide educational and economic opportunities in order to enable students to take full advantage of existing federal, state, local and private educational and vocational training programs;
- To design and implement programs of economic, education, social, and civic development;

- To receive grants, gifts, endowments, devises and bequests that will be used to carry out the purposes and objectives of this corporation; and
- To carry on any activities necessary to carry out the goals and objectives of this corporation.
